Make your own Tambourine!

Materials for basic tambourine:

2 aluminum pie tins (or paper plates)

Stapler

Dried beans (or rice, beads, small rocks)

Construction paper AND/OR stickers

Markers (and/or crayons, paints, stickers, sticker paper)

Glue

Scissors

*Extras: puff paints, glitter pens



Basic Tambourine:

- 1. If you're using construction paper and glue to cover the tambourine, first cut out circles of construction paper to fit on the bottoms of the pie tins or paper plates.
- 2. Decorate the construction paper circles with crayons, markers, paints, cut and glue construction paper shapes, stickers, etc.
- 3. Fill one tin or plate full of dried beans or similar material.
- 4. Put the other tin or plate on top of the first and staple them together.

Materials for advanced tambourine:

1 aluminum pie tin

Construction paper OR stickers

Markers (and/or crayons, paints, stickers, sticker paper)

8-10 large washers (from the hardware store, they're shaped like a doughnut) Colorful ribbon

Hole punch or sharp scissors

*Extras: small round bells - be sure they have a holder on one end to attach the bell (found in craft stores and fabric stores)

Advanced Tambourine:

Follow steps 1 and 2 above to decorate the tambourine

- 1. Punch holes (or poke holes with sharp scissors) around the edges of the pie tin, about 1-2 inches apart.
- 2. Cut ribbon into 3 inch pieces.
- 3. Thread the ribbon pieces through a washer and then through one of the holes on the side of the tambourine. You can add 2 or 3 washers for extra noise. Try shaking the tambourine and make sure that the washers are banging up against the sides of the tin.
- 4. If you're adding bells, thread the ribbon through the bell and then through the holes on the side of the tambourine.

When you hear the name of Haman, SHAKE THAT TAMBOURINE!!
