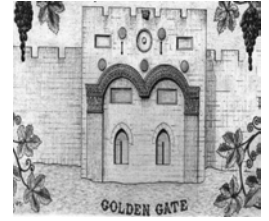

VIHUDA L'OLAM TEISHEIV Judah shall abide for ever, Jerusalem from generation to generation.

AL NAHAROT BAVEL By the river of Babylon, there we sat down, yea, we wept, when we remembered Zion. Upon the willow in the midst thereof we hanged up our harps. For there they that led us captive asked of us words of song, and our tormentors asked of us mirth: 'Sing us one of the songs of Zion.' How shall we sing the Lord's song in a foreign land? If I forget thee, O Jerusalem, let my right hand forget her cunning. Let my tongue cleave to the roof of my mouth, if I remember thee not; if I set not Jerusalem above my chiefest joy. Remember, O Lord, against the Edomites the day of Jerusalem's fall; how they cried, "Strip her, strip her to her very foundations!" Fair Babylon, that art to be destroyed; happy shall he be, that repayeth thee as thou hast served us. Happy shall he be, that taketh and dasheth thy little ones against the rocks!

KI MITZIYON Truly out of Zion shall come forth the Torah, and the word of the Lord out of Jerusalem.

ELI TSIYON For Zion and her cities I mourn like a mother in her anguish, like a woman who mourns the husband of her youth. I mourn the exile of God's servants, makers of sweet melody, their blood poured out like Zion's streams.

SISU ET Y'RUSHALAYIM Celebrate Jerusalem, rejoice in her, rejoice in her all who love her. On your walls, City of David, I have appointed guards all day and all night.

YERUSHALAYIM From the peak of Mount Scopus, I greet you, Jerusalem. From the peak of Mount Scopus, I bow to you. For hundred generations I have dreamed of you, once more to be privileged to see your glory. Jerusalem, Jerusalem! Smile on your children once more! Jerusalem, Jerusalem! Out of your ruin I will rebuild you! From the peak of Mount Scopus, shalom, Jerusalem! A thousand exiles from all the ends of the earth lift up their eyes to you. Be blessed with thousands of blessings, a King's temple, a royal city. Jerusalem, Jerusalem! I will not move from this place! Jerusalem, Jerusalem! Let the redemption come, let it come!

LACH YERUSHALAYIM For you, Jerusalem, between the city's walls, for you, Jerusalem, a new light will shine. YAH RIBON OLAM God, Master of all worlds, You are the King - the King of kings. The work of Your might and Your wondrous deeds, it is fitting to declare before You. Praise I will present morning and night to You, holy God who created all life. Holy angels and humans, beasts of the field and birds of the sky to Your Holy Temple return and to the Holy of Holies, the place where they will rejoice - spirits and souls; and they will sing to You songs and praise in Jerusalem, city of beauty.

SAMACHTI B'OMRIM LI I rejoiced when they said to me: Let us go up to the House of God. Now we stand within your gates, O Jerusalem! Jerusalem, built to be a city where people come together as one! Pray for the peace of Jerusalem: May those who love you prosper! For the sake of my people, my friends, I pray you find peace. For the sake of the house of Adonai our God, I will seek your good.

YERUSHALAYIM SHEL ZAHAV Jerusalem, city of gold, of copper and of light, am I not a harp for all your songs?

URI TSIYON Awake, awake, put on thy strength, O Zion; put on thy beautiful garments, O Jerusalem, the holy city, for henceforth there shall no more come into thee the uncircumcised and the unclean. Shake thyself from the dust; [arise, and sit down,] O Jerusalem.

HATIKVA As long as in the depths of the heart the Jewish soul still yearns. And towards the East, the eye continues to seek Zion. We have not yet lost our hope, the hope of two thousand years, to be a free nation in our homeland, the land of Zion and Jerusalem.
