



This Haggadah follows the traditional seder order, uses gender-neutral language and is geared to the reading level of school-age children.
Transliterations and translations of Hebrew blessings and prayers are included, as are additional discussion questions, songs, crafts and games.






Telling the Story: A Passover Haggadah Explained





