Mackenzie Melemed, pianist, born in 1995 in Newton, Massachusetts, is a Prize Winner of the 2012 Sixth New York International Piano Competition, a biennial event presented under the auspices of The Stecher and Horowitz Foundation. In addition to his cash prize for the best performance of the required commissioned "3 Etudes by Avner Dorman," he will be appearing in concerts on the Foundations Young Artists Series, provided throughout the year.

He began playing the piano at the age of four and started classical training at ten. Since 2000, he has performed over 600 concerts for the elderly, charitable organizations, and at local schools encouraging students to share their talents within their communities. Mackenzie was asked to perform for President Bush at a fundraiser in Boston in early 2004. Subsequently, he was asked to perform traditional holiday music at the White House Holiday Open House, and performed at the White House for five consecutive years. He won Grand Prize in the Bradshaw and Buono International Piano Competition, resulting in a performance at Weill Recital Hall in 2006.

Mackenzie performed on the PBS television show, "From the Top: Live at Carnegie Hall" at Zankel Recital Hall in 2008. In 2009, he performed the Grieg Piano Concerto with the Seven Hills Symphony in Worcester, MA, and the Boston Civic Symphony Orchestra, in Weston, MA. Each of the performances resulted from a First Place Prize in both of the orchestras' annual Young Artist Competitions.

In 2009, he was the Second Place Winner of the Steinway Society of Boston's Young Artist Competition. Last year, he won First Prize at the A. Ramon Rivera Piano Competition.

During the past two years, Mackenzie performed Prokofiev's First Piano Concerto with the Quincy Symphony (MA), the Wellesley Symphony (MA), and with the New England Philharmonic. He appeared once again on "From the Top" in January of 2011, this time on the radio show at New England Conservatory's Jordan Recital Hall in Boston.

Mackenzie attended the Piano Summer Festival at New Paltz, under the direction of Vladimir Feltsman, and is currently studying at The Juilliard School with Robert McDonald. He has a passion for foreign languages and hopes to someday get his private pilot license..
