From Princeton to Pitching to Purim... How One Ballplayer Came to Choose Judaism

Bob Tufts, a former major league baseball pitcher, is one of only six major league players to convert to Judaism during their playing careers. **Rabbi Davidson** will interview him about his path to "becoming American through baseball and Judaism."

Mr. Tufts received a bachelor's degree in economics from Princeton University in 1977. His first career upon graduation was as a professional baseball player – a 12^{th} round draft pick of the San Francisco Giants. He appeared in the major leagues as a relief pitcher with the Giants in 1981 and the Kansas City Royals in 1982 and 1983. Upon retirement from baseball, he attended Columbia University and received an MBA in finance. He has more than 20 years of experience working on Wall Street. He is currently an adjunct professor at Yeshiva University, where he teaches sports marketing, principles of management, new-venture planning and entrepreneurship.
